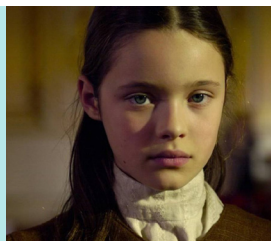

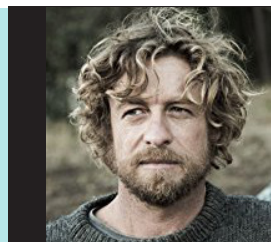

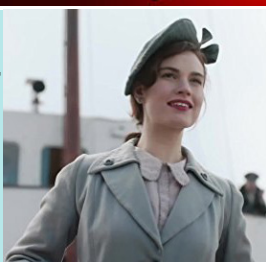
THE GUERNSEY LITERARY AND POTATO PEEL PIE SOCIETY
