SDRG member and local farmer, Anna Toland said the event hopes to give rural citizens a night off and a chance to catch up with old friends and neighbours they may not have seen for years.

"We know that some are doing it tough due to the dry conditions and lack of feed and water and we really wanted to organise a fun, free family event for them to forget," Ms Toland explained.

"We heard about the wonderful success of the Moglonemby Hall event in April and we wanted to do something similar and invite the farmers in for a free meal and some entertainment for the kids."
