OVER \$6000 RAISED FOR CURE BRAIN CANCER FOUNDATION

Over 200 people attended the Euroa Community Cinema on Friday, 13th July for a fundraiser screening of *Incredibles 2*.

Euroa locals Dustin Perry and Steven Jeffery and their families hosted the screening, with all proceeds going directly to Cure Brain Cancer Foundation.

The movie fundraiser amassed approximately \$3000 in ticket sales, food sales, raffle tickets and cash donations.

Additionally, St John's Primary School Euroa hosted a 'Brekky for Brain Cancer' in May, raising an impressive \$3500.

In keeping with the *Incredibles 2* theme, children were invited to dress up as their favourite superhero or villain.

Over twenty children lined up on the stage prior to the film to display their dress up costumes, with prizes going to the crowd's favourites.

The fundraiser was held in collaboration with Ruralco Property Rodwells, St John's Primary School and Strathbogie Shire Council.

The Perry family, alongside the Jefferys, have been strong advocates for the Cure Brain Cancer Foundation since their nine-year-old daughter and sister Chloe Perry was diagnosed with the disease, which sadly took her life in December 2017.

Mr Perry said this is the second year they have run the movie fundraiser for the Cure Brain Cancer Foundation, which aims to fund research and clinical trials to advance treatments.

"Brain cancer kills more Australian children than any other cancer, and at the moment the survival rate is so low. Brain cancer should get a lot more attention," Mr Perry explained.

Strathbogie Shire Mayor Amanda McClaren said she was hugely impressed with the outcomes of such an important fundraiser.

"The local support for the Perry and Jeffery families is a wonderful example of how remarkably generous and caring the Strathbogie Shire community is," Cr McClaren said.
