# Nagambie and District: Local Emergency Action Plan (LEAP)



Nagambie's local risks are:

## Flood, Fire, Storm, Heatwave & Transport Accidents

The community have identified the impacts of these events as resulting in loss of power and communications infrastructure, and impacting the community's general wellbeing through threats to life, mental health, access to essential supplies and financial loss.

The aim of this action plan is to build greater community resilience in emergencies by increasing the awareness of our local emergency risks and the steps that community and individuals can take to prepare, respond and recover from these emergencies.

Strathbogie Shire Council acknowledges the Taungurung peoples as Traditional Custodians of the Nagambie area. We recognise and respect the enduring relationship they have with their lands and waters, and we pay respects to the Elders past, present and emerging.

### **Emergency preparedness**

#### Preparation is key

In an emergency event, power, water, telecommunications, and transport networks may be impacted, causing disruptions and isolation to households and communities.

Emergency services such as CFA, SES, Police and Ambulance services will be in high demand. Therefore, it is important that every household develops an emergency plan that includes preparation for up to 72 hours of isolation.

Prepare a household emergency kit that includes a battery powered radio & torch, important papers and contact numbers etc. Download the VicEmergency App, monitor warnings and be prepared to act.

Emergency management is a shared responsibility between individuals, communities, Council and agencies (eg CFA, Police, SES). Preparation is key to reducing impacts and to supporting emergency services.

### The 3 phases of an emergency event

1. Preparedness (planning and preparation before the event)

Nagambie local risks are: Flooding (Goulburn River and overland through the Tabilk Depression), Bushfire/Grass Fire, Wind Storms (Thunderstorm asthma, trees over roads) and Heatwaves. The community also identified the problems with local power outages, the poor condition of roads and the hazard posed by collisions with wildlife in the Nagambie area.

- 2. Response (during the event, largely the responsibility of control agencies eg CFA fire, SES Flood).
- 3. Recovery (after the event)

The following priority actions in this plan address these 3 phases of an emergency event.

### **LEAP Priority Actions**

#### 1. Preparedness

1.2 Household Emergency Plans preparation (including Vic Emergency App)	CFA/Red Cross/SES	October annually
1.3 Conduct Emergency Planning sessions for Businesses	Agriculture Victoria/ Council/SES/CFA	April biannually
1.4 Annual fire prevention program	Council	August – October annually
1.5 Conduct a First 72 Hours workshop	Council/Agencies	March annually
1.6 Incorporation of flood overlay controls for Nagambie in the Planning Scheme	Council/Community/ Goulburn Broken CMA	2025
1.7 Trial a Good neighbour initiative	Council/Community	2025
1.8 Explore establishment of local emergency communication	Council/Community/ Agencies	2025

3.1 Implement a coordinated/safe approach to restoration and cleanup activities as soon as possible after an emergency.	Community/Council	Ongoing
3.2 Establish information about support, advice and services available to the community following emergencies.	Community/Council	Ongoing
3.3 Coordinate regular community meetings post emergency event	Council/Agencies	As required
3.4 Conduct a debrief with the community	Council/Community/ Agencies	Max 2 years after event


